The Great Commission

Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, to the mountain which Jesus had appointed for them. When they saw Him, they worshiped Him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age.



Questions:

Can God be known? Does God desire to be known?

- God's great desire is for us to know Him and for Him to know us!
- He delights in being know by people

What is the goal of existence:

- To love and be loved
- To know and be known (Core of salvation and the very purpose of life)

To be ignorant of God..... is DEATH!

- Utter misery
- Destruction

What is the difference between mind knowledge and heart knowledge?

- How do you get heart knowledge (Prayer)
- The tragedy of the fall of man

God does not take pleasure in all the fallen concepts of men about His existence.

- He is not simply a part of creation
- Some people think He is an impersonal force
- Some people think He is various and multiple (polytheists)
- He is a Father, He has a Son, and a Holy Spirit that proceeds from the Father

......False truths are not just sad, they are tragic.

Those who believe falsehood will likely not come to know the true God but will settle for a god in their imagination. They will have a false god in their heads, made in their own image.

Certainly not the true revealed God.



I once knew a physician who told me...

"If you ask a patient what's wrong with them, they can usually tell you, especially if you ask the right questions."

He went on to say:

"Young physicians are all about the lab values, I'm about asking the patient. They are right more often than not."

"I've had people tell me correctly that they had brain tumors, rare diseases, etc. You have to learn to listen closely without too much of an agenda"

Why is the age group missing?
